A Story Worth Telling

Homelessness in New York City has reached the highest levels since the Great Depression. Tonight, **61,471 people will sleep in a New York City shelter**...and that number doesn't reflect those who are living on the streets, in subways and in train stations. **That's why we plan to raise \$61,471 during Advent**—**\$1 for every homeless person in a shelter in New York City.**

The funds will go to **New York City Relief**, a mobile outreach ministry that has been compassionately—and uniquely—serving the homeless since 1989. Eight times a week, two converted school buses travel to Harlem, the South Bronx, Paterson and Newark, where staff and volunteers set up tables, chairs and tents on the sidewalk for their guests. They serve homemade soup and fresh-baked bread, hand out new socks and toiletry kits, and offer prayers and life-transforming connections to food, shelter, clothing, detox, job training and medical care.

"Their holistic approach is what makes New York City Relief unique," said Pastor Penny, who served with the



ministry in Harlem this past June. "The soup, bread and socks meet people's immediate needs, and the one-on-one 'life care visits' make a long-term difference." During a life care visit, which takes place on the Relief Bus, a staff member assesses the client's needs and connects him or her to specific resources. "But it doesn't end there," said Pastor Penny. "They book appointments and make phone calls on behalf of their clients. And they follow up—navigating government agencies, filling out paperwork and attending meetings to advocate for their clients." The result? Lives are transformed.

Juan Galloway, president and CEO of New York City Relief, will be preaching at all three services today as we kick off our Advent/Christmas Campaign to raise \$61,471 for our homeless brothers and sisters. On each Sunday during Advent, you'll also have an opportunity to sign up to serve on the Relief Bus.
