## **A Story Worth Telling**

Meet Angel.

He grew up in Spanish Harlem, developmentally challenged, in one of the most dangerous projects. His brother was addicted to crack and would beat him senseless—once to the point of landing him in the hospital in a coma. Angel was vulnerable.

"He's a classic example of someone who would have fallen through the cracks and possibly ended up on the streets," said Claudia Wittel, vice president for advancement at New York City Relief, our Advent/Christmas mission partner.

Fortunately, Angel made his way to Park Avenue between 124th and 125th Streets one day and connected with The Relief Bus. There, he received homemade soup and fresh-baked bread, socks, a toiletry kit, prayers and lots of love. Now he has a routine. "Every month, every week, every Friday and Saturday, all year round, I'm here with my family at The Relief Bus," Angel said.



"The thing that really cements what New York City Relief has been for Angel is the consistency that we bring," said Brett Hartford, outreach director. "It's something he has never had in his entire life. That has changed who Angel is and restored joy in his life."

"Angel is thriving. He looks great. He is vibrant," said Claudia. "And he loves to speak to anyone who comes to serve to tell them about his experience with New York City Relief. I'm so grateful to have been a part of the work that goes into a life like Angel's."

#### **Advent Sermon Series: Prophets Then, Prophets Now**

As we prepare for Christmas, we'll spend some time with prophets—both those who inspired Jesus and those who were inspired by him. Prophets do not necessarily predict what will

happen as much as they reveal what *is* happening, and what we are often conditioned not to see. They criticize the dominant consciousness, which too often benefits the few at the expense of the many, and energize us toward an alternative consciousness that is more fully aligned with God's intentions. Unless we understand this, we can't fully understand Jesus, who criticizes the kingdoms and empires of this world and energizes us toward an alternative—the kingdom of God. Unless we understand this, we can't fully understand



who God is calling us to be as Christians. This Advent we'll be challenged to "keep Christ in Christmas" by keeping the prophetic edge alive in the church and in all who call themselves "little Christs." — Pastor Marc Oehler
